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## *Investing in Girls' Rights: Aspects and Challenges*



AZARA, October 16: The International Day of the Girl Child was observed jointly by the Department of Political Science and History on 11th October, 2023. On this occasion, a lecture was organised which was delivered by Dr. Smita Sarmah, Assistant Professor, Department of Law, Cotton University. Dr. Sarmah spoke on the topic 'Investing in Girls' Rights: Aspects and Challenges'. The lecture session was attended by the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, Prof. Kandarpa Das along with the faculty members and students of various departments of the University. Hon'ble Vice Chancellor addressed the audience with his speech which focussed on the significance of the occasion. He informed the audience regarding the requirement of additional protective measures to save the girl child from the existing discriminatory practices prevalent against them. The speaker, in her lecture, drew the attention of all the prevailing discriminations and injustices meted out to the girl child as well as the women globally. She particularly highlighted the atrocities, both mental and physical committed against the girl child in different societies of India. Dr. Sarmah spoke in detail about the comprehensive mechanism available both nationally and internationally to protect the rights of the girl child. She also highlighted the enumerated provisions of the Indian Constitution which specifically protects the rights of the girl child as well as the women. She made the participants aware of the existing laws and their effectiveness in protecting the girl child in India. The lecture was followed by a question-answer session where the students participated wholeheartedly. The session was concluded with a formal vote of thanks proposed by Dr. Anisha Bordoloi, Assistant Professor, Department of History.
