INSPIRING INNOVATION: EXPERT TALK ON ENTREPRENEURSHIP DEVELOPMENT AT GCU



BACK FROM THE BRINK: A RIVETING EXCURSION THROUGH ENDANGERED RHINO TERRITORY



AZARA, April 25: Students of the Department of Commerce embarked on an adventurous trip to Manas National Park & Tiger Reserve on 19th and 20th April, 2024, accompanied by two faculty members. Our team started their remarkable journey from GCU campus to the National Park and then took the safari through the forest and towards the Bhutan border. Over the next three hours, the group encountered wild rhinos and elephants in the vast bio-reserve situated around the breathtakingly beautiful Manas River, a major tributary of the Brahmaputra. The usually reticent animals were drawn to the highway by the promise of newly sprouted foliage along the road in the April spring.







The Manas National Park was known as a hunting reserve of the Cooch Behar royal family and the Raja of Gauripur before being turned into a bio-reserve in 1973. In 1985, it was declared a World Heritage Site by the UNESCO; however, heavy poaching and militant activities forced the UNESCO to list its name as a World Heritage Site in Danger. Over the years, however, concerted efforts at preserving the flora and fauna of the forests bore fruit and in 2011, Manas was finally removed from the UNESCO 'danger list'.
