PROGRAMME OUTCOMES (PO)

The students on completion of the Masters Programme shall be able to

- 1. Demonstrate an in-depth comprehension of fundamental theories and concepts and awareness of social problems.
- 2. Application of knowledge-based ideas, and quantitative and qualitative approaches to effectively analyze and resolve complex real-world problems.
- 3. Inculcate a research-oriented mindset by identifying problems, conducting a relevant review of literature, and analyzing specific issues.
- 4. Improve social understanding for negotiating multiple perspectives such as, political, historical, economic, and cultural, through interdisciplinary approaches to draw evidence-based inferences.
