#### MASTER OF SOCIAL WORK PROGRAMME

#### **PROGRAMME OUTCOMES (PO)**

The students on completion of the Masters Programme shall be able to

- 1. Demonstrate an in-depth comprehension of fundamental theories and concepts and awareness of social problems.
