NEWS BULLETIN WORKSHOP ON "WONDERS OF OUR NATURE 2.0" AT GCU TEZPUR CAMPUS

AZARA, November 12: On October 29, 2024, the School of Pharmaceutical Sciences at Girijananda Chowdhury University (GCU), Tezpur Campus, successfully hosted a workshop on "Wonders of Our Nature 2.0." The session began with an inauguration ceremony led by Prof. Abdul Baquee Ahmed, Principal of SOPS, GCU Tezpur, who lit the ceremonial lamp alongside Prof. of Practice Saurav Borkataki and other distinguished guests and nature enthusiasts, including Mr. Sanjay Baruah, Mr. Muhsinoor Rahman, Mr. Bapdhon Das, as well as faculty members.

Prof. Ahmed welcomed attendees and introduced the workshop's resource person, Prof. of Practice Saurav Borkataki, former Honorary Wildlife Warden of Sonitpur, Environment and Forest Department Known as "Sarpa Bandhab" (Friend of Snakes), a title conferred by the Assam Sahitya Sabha, Prof. Borkataki is a respected wildlife rescuer with over 30 years of contributions to wildlife, nature conservation, and social awareness. He was honoured as a "Professor of Practice" by Manipur International University.

Prof. Borkataki delivered an engaging lecture on "Venom, Antivenom, and Wildlife Rescue: Medical Challenges and Solutions." During his presentation, he explained how Assamese folklore, particularly the mythological tale of Sati Beula and Lakhindar, has influenced people's intense fear of snakes. In this story, the snake depicted is believed to be the Ornate Flying Snake (locally known as Kaal Sundari) - a strikingly beautiful, mildly venomous species found in Northeast India, known to prey on small animals like pigeons.

Borkataki's mission is to reduce the fear of snakes in the coming years. Prof. Borkataki's talk included a video showcasing his rescue operations involving wild elephants, pythons, civet cats, and various venomous snakes in Sonitpur district, Assam. He also shared photos of both venomous and non-venomous snakes he has rescued, highlighting his life-saving work in treating venomous snakebite victims. Thanks to his efforts, antivenom are now widely available in government hospitals across the region.

The workshop was highly enriching, concluding with an interactive Q&A session between Prof. Borkataki, the students, faculty members and all the staff. Prof. Abdul Baquee Ahmed expressed appreciation for the successful organization of the event and acknowledged the contributions of the workshop's Convenor, Ms. Punamjyoti Das, and Co-Convenor, Dr. Hemanga Hazarika, Assistant Professor at SOPS, GCU Tezpur.

Mr. Susankar Kushari presented his research on "Quantification of variation in L-theanine content depends on seasonal, geographical and maturity onset factors in Assam tea leaves and evaluation of acute effects associated hippocampal with hedonic performance using suitable animal model" under the guidance of Prof. Dipankar Saha, School of Pharmaceutical Sciences, Girijananda Chowdhury University, Guwahati, Assam. His presentation offered novel insights, thorough analysis, and practical implications, garnering widespread appreciation from both the audience and the judging panel. The Best Oral Presentation Award was adjudicated based on several key criteria, including originality of research, depth of analysis, clarity of presentation, and the potential impact on the field.
