GUWAHATI, Mar 21: Dr. Bondita Baruah from the Department of English and Foreign Languages, Girijananda Chowdhury University was invited as a speaker at the two-Day National Seminar “Assam After 1980: Politics, Identity and Development” on the 6th and 7th of March, 2025, organized by the Tribal Studies Centre and Department of History, Assam University, Diphu Campus and sponsored by Indian Council of Social Science Research (ICSSR), New Delhi.
